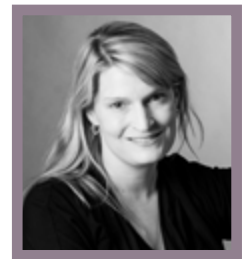
Andrea Cohen's collections include *Unfathoming* (Four Way Books, 2017), *Furs Not Mine* (Four Way, 2015), *Kentucky Derby* (Salmon Poetry, 2011), *Long Division* (Salmon Poetry, 2009), and *The Cartographer's Vacation* (Owl Creek Press, 1999). Her new book, *Nightshade* will appear this year from Four Way Books.
